TJ Huffman (Fire) – Provided an update on Fire Department operations.

Price (Streets & Parks) – Provided an update on Street and Park operations.

Beidelschies (Board of Public Affairs) – Provided an update from BPA.

Greg Glick (Fiscal Officer) – Provided an update on Finances.

Rasmussen (Solicitor) – Discussion was held concerning Grant Writing, 501 N. Main Street house and the dog situation at the corner of Deerfield and N. Main St.

Fahy (Blanchard Design Associates) – Discussed the recent smoke testing of the sewer system.

Huffman (Finance, Fire & Capital Projects) – Further discussion concerning the possibility of hiring a Grant Writer.

Bell (Community Development & Business Relations, & Zoning) – No report.

Latta (Maintenance, Safety, Trees & Street Lights) – Not present.

Barker (Parks & Recreation) – Working on quotes for tennis courts and pricing for field rentals. Pool last day will be August 31st.

Dempster (Streets, Sidewalks & EMS) – EMS has given the Village parking blocks to try in the park to stop cars from parking on the walking path.

Smith (Mayor) – Discussion was held concerning traffic lights and the renters of the Village trailer.

Old Business:

Fiscal Officer third reading of Ordinance 2022-09 assessing a 1.7 mill Special Assessment for Street Lighting. Motion by Huffman and seconded by Barker to approve Ordinance 2022-09. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Fiscal Officer gave third reading of Ordinance 2022-10 assessing a 1.3 mill Special Assessment for Street Repair. Motion by Bell and seconded by Dempster to approve Ordinance 2022-10. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

New Business:

Fiscal Officer gave first reading of Ordinance 2022-11 transferring \$15,000 from the General Fund to the Park and Recreation Fund. Motion by Barker and second by Huffman to suspend the rules and give Ordinance 2022-11 its second and third readings. Roll call vote, all yes. Motion carried. Fiscal Officer gave second and third readings of Ordinance No 2022-11. Motion by Dempster and second by Bell to adopt Ordinance 2022-11. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Barker and seconded by Huffman to allow the Football Team to use the shelter house on August 25th and October 6th for team meal Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Dempster and seconded by Huffman to excuse Latta and Sparks from the meeting. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Dempster and seconded by Huffman to provide free admission to the pool on August 30 and 31, 2022, with the Findlay-Hancock County Community Foundation contributing \$125 per day. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Barker and seconded by Huffman to approve the Cash Summary by Fund as of July 31, 2022. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

With funds currently available to pay all obligations and funds available when the obligations were incurred, Motion by Bell and seconded by Dempster to approve payment of the bills as presented
