Jamie Insley (Zoning Inspector) – Provided an update on zoning activities. Discussion was held on a proposal for a storage building at Hurdwell.

Beidelschies (Board of Public Affairs) – Provided an update from the BPA.

Rob Feighner (Solicitor) – Provided an update on Legal matters.

Greg Glick (Fiscal Officer) – Provided an update on finances.

Old Business:

Motion by Huffman and seconded by Dempster to allow the sale of alcohol at the Village Festival. Voice vote, 5 yes; Sparks no. Motion carried.

New Business:

Motion by Dempster and seconded by Latta to permit a Sports Zone on Field 1 at the Festival. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Sparks and seconded by Dempster to provide credits to the following individuals sewer bills: Morgan Wykes \$120.25, Randi Evans \$48.75 and Gregg Feller \$19.50. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Barker and seconded by Bell to contract with Chatelain Plastic for an entrance sign at the South end of the park at a cost of \$900. Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.

With funds currently available to pay all obligations and funds available when the obligations were incurred, Motion by Huffman and seconded by Barker to approve payment of the bills as presented (listing attached). Voice vote, all yes. Motion carried.
